The **Kathismata** from the Octoechos, Tone 1. The verse on ‘Both now’ of the first Kathisma is replaced by the Resurrectional Dismissal Theotokion of Tone 1:

When Gabriel announced to thee, “Rejoice!” the Master of all became incarnate within thee, O Virgin: the holy tabernacle, at his cry, as the righteous David said. Thou wast shown to be more spacious than the heavens, having borne thy Creator. Glory to Him Who made His abode within thee! Glory to Him Who came forth from thee! Glory to Him Who hath set us free by thy birthgiving.

#### PROKEIMENON Tone 4

Blessed art Thou, O Lord God of our fathers, \* and praised and glorified is Thy name forever!  
v: For Thou art just in all that Thou hast done for us!

**EPISTLE:** Hebrews 11:24-26, 32-40

#### ALLELUIA

v: Moses and Aaron among His priests, and Samuel among those who called on His Name.  
v: They called to the Lord and He answered them.

**GOSPEL:** John 1:43-51

#### MEGALYNARION

“All of creation rejoices in Thee ...”

#### COMMUNION HYMN

Praise the Lord from the heavens, praise Him in the highest! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia!

#### THE PROCESSION OF THE HOLY ICONS

This takes place immediately after the Prayer behind the Ambon. The procession is led by servers carrying candles and the Cross, followed by the priest carrying the Gospel Book and the people carrying the icons of Christ, the Theotokos and the Saints. Weather permitting, the procession goes around the outside of the church. If it is raining, the procession is inside, following the route of the Great Entrance. The Choir sings “Holy God...” repeatedly.

When the Priest reaches the Solea, we sing the **Troparion of the Sunday of Orthodoxy** (Green Book page 24)

Then the Priest reads an excerpt from the **Synodikon** (Confession of Faith) of the Sunday of Orthodoxy.

#### **Great Prokeimenon:**

Who is so great a God as our God? \* Thou art our God, who dost wonders!

v: Thou hast made Thy power known among the peoples; with Thine arm hast thou redeemed thy people.

v: And I said: Now have I made a beginning; this change hath been wrought by the right hand of the Most High.

v: I remembered the works of the Lord; for I will remember Thy wonders from the beginning.

Repeat the **Troparion of the Sunday of Orthodoxy**. The Liturgy is then concluded as usual from “Blessed be the Name of the Lord ...”
